- Tell the talented that they are talented

Tell crucial truth because student trusts you as a professional

## American

Make positive comments to encourage student

## Asian

Don't praise too much so the student will work twice as hard to become proficient

- Teacher not being a real professional
- Not being honest to each other
- Causes ambiguity and confusion about the value of art
- X Decreases the level of musicians
- Will be disappointed/surprised later on
- \* Wasting time by not planning future properly
